Salvation: UC – What difference does the Resurrection make for Christians?

What should we know?

Christians believe salvation includes the ongoing restoration of human’s relationship with God.

The Gospel gives accounts of Jesus’ death and resurrection

Belief in Jesus’ resurrection confirms to Christians that Jesus is the incarnate Son of God, but also that death is not the end.

This belief gives Christians hope for life with God, starting now and continuing in a new life (Heaven).



What should we be able to do:

Suggest meanings for resurrection accounts, and compare their ideas with ways in which Christians interpret these texts, showing awareness of the centrality of the Christian belief of resurrection.

Explain connections between Luke 24 and the Christian concept of Sacrifice, Resurrection, Salvation, Incarnation and Hope, using theological terms.

Make clear connections between Christian belief in the Resurrection and how Christians worship on Good Friday and Easter Sunday.
