As part of your child's learning at Bishop King, we ensure through our Physical, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) and Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) curriculum that children have the ability to safeguard themselves.

The intention of PSHE & RSE is to allow time in the curriculum to develop, explore and teach personal, social and healthy wellbeing for our children. Throughout our curriculum, we provide opportunities to access learning that aims to support their lifestyle in the present and the future. This is to develop their knowledge in coping strategies, prepare them for responsibility, how their bodies will change and how to live in a respectful and mindful world.

The Department of Education in 2020 announced statutory changes within the RSE curriculum, which we must comply with and have been working to update our programme of study. Throughout our PSHE learning, the following core themes are currently being covered: Relationships, Living in the Wider World and Healthy Living. With the additional RSE requirements, we are able to provide and be sure that our provision appropriately supports our children based on:

- Age
- Physical and Emotional Maturity
- Religious and Cultural Backgrounds
- Special Educational Needs

To ensure that our provision works in line with our own Church School Values, we find support within the document 'Valuing All God's Children' from the Church of England Education Office when exploring diversity within modern Britain. Please be reassured that the learning within the RSE curriculum will only be based on what is appropriate for your child with their safety and wellbeing being paramount.
