Salvation: UC – What did Jesus do to save Human beings?

What should we know?

Christians believe the Bible points out the need for God to save his people. This includes the on-going restoration of human's relationship with God.

The Gospels give accounts of Jesus' death and resurrection.

The New Testament says that Jesus' death was 'for us'.

Christians remember Jesus' sacrifice through the service of Holy Communion.



What should we be able to do:

Explain what Christians mean when they say that Jesus' death was a sacrifice, using theological terms.

Suggest meanings for narratives of Jesus' death/resurrection comparing their ideas with ways in which Christians interpret these texts.

Make clear connections between Christian belief in Jesus' death as a sacrifice and how Christians celebrate Holy Communion.
