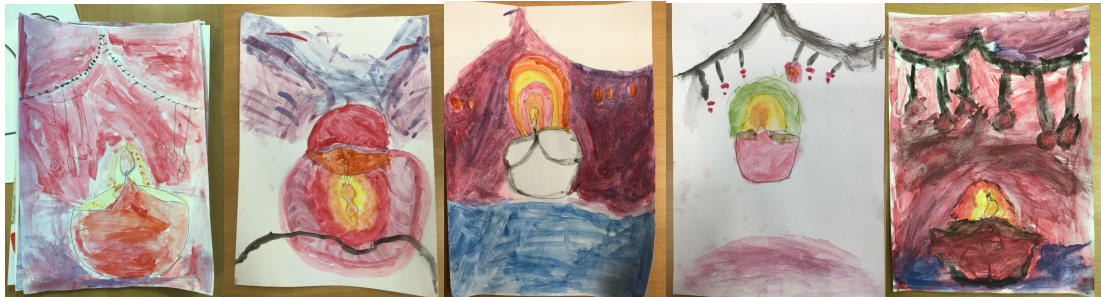


## ‘Developing a unique and bespoke curriculum’

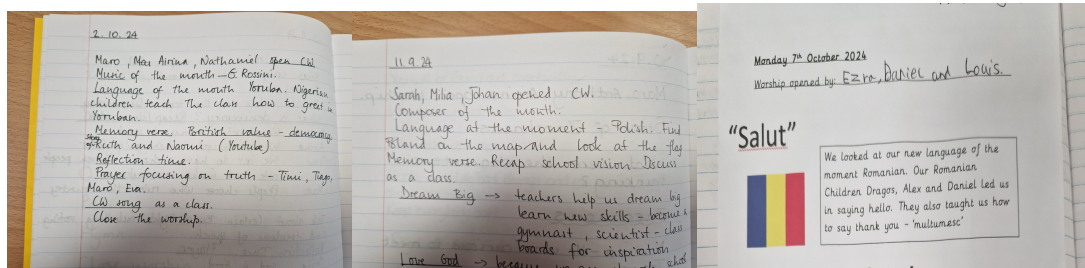
### KS2 evidence

#### Diwali

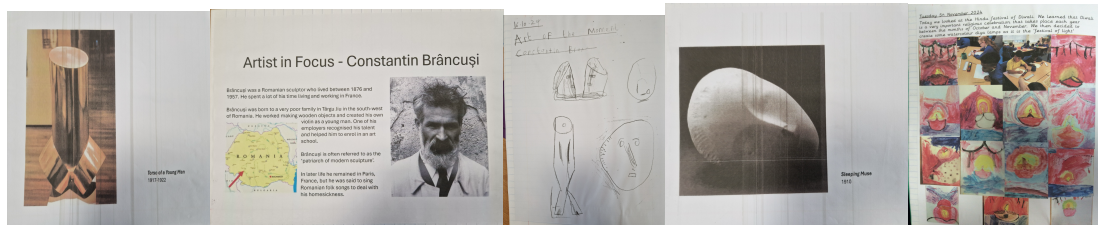
Children in Year 4 created image in response to a class discussion about Diwali.



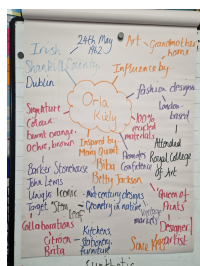
There is evidence of children learning about ‘**language of the moments**’ and ‘**composer of the moment**’ within class worship books. The children really enjoy sharing their home language with their friends and being the teachers through sharing some key words. Dragos, Alex and Daniel in Year 4 are Romanian so taught their class to say ‘hello’, ‘goodbye’ and ‘thankyou’.



In **Years 3 and 4** they have been looking at the Artist of the month ‘**Constantin Brancusi**’ who is a Romanian Sculptor. They created some pencil drawings of some of his sculptures.



As part of the Charanga scheme **year 3** children have been learning about ‘**Rhythm and Blues**’ music. They have found out about th countries of origin and how it differs from other genres of music. The children really enjoyed listening to and joining in with different R & B singers and groups and have even had a go at performing to each other some simple tracks.



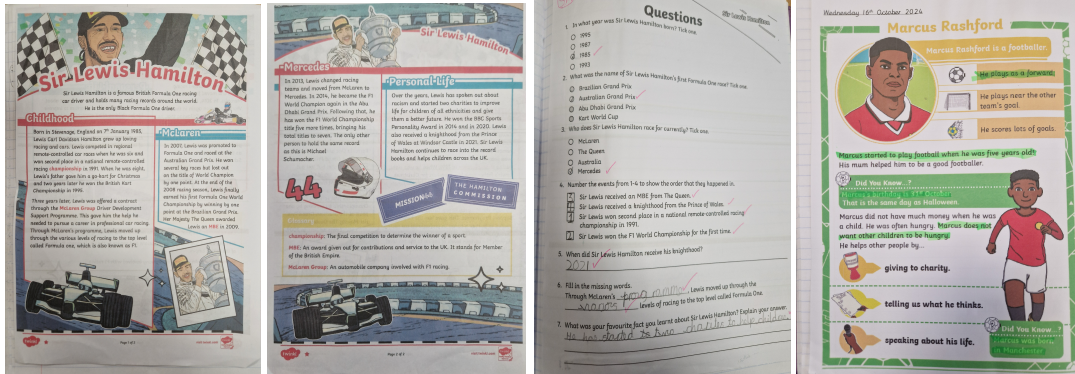

## Black History comprehensions

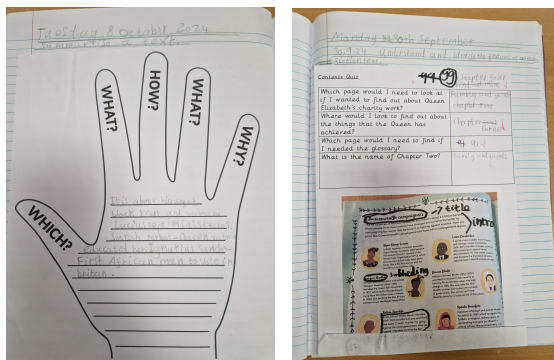
### Year 3

Katherine Johnsons, a mathematician whose calculations of orbital machanics whilst working for NASA were critical to the success of US crewed space flights.

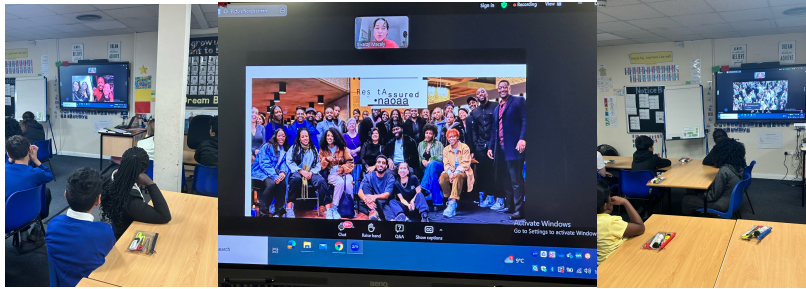

The main focus being on these women’s achievements and resilience whilst celebrating, and giving them credit they deserve. These women were: Dina Asher-Smith (fastest British woman in history), Anne-Marie Imafidon MBE (High achiever in STEM), Sharon White OBE (Highly successful business woman who was CEO of Ofcom and currently
