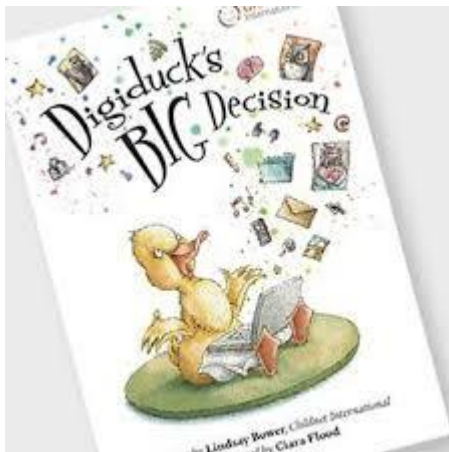


## Online Safety resources for Key Stage 1

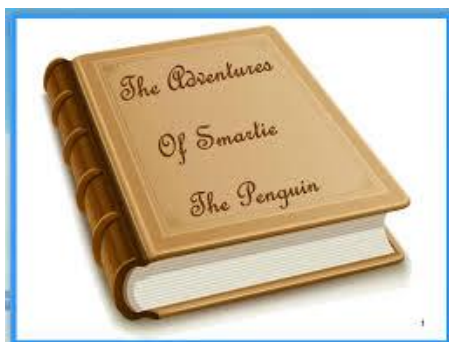


### **Digi Duck's Big Decision**
